What's in the Bill

Unemployment Support

- Second round of checks for \$600/adult and child
- Extends enhanced UI for 10 weeks, adds \$300/week

Housing Support

- Extends eviction moratorium to 1/31/21
- \$25 billion for rental assistance

Health Care

- \$20 billion for Purchasing Vaccines
- \$8 billion for Vaccine Distribution
- \$20 billion for States' Testing Infrastructure
- \$20 billion in Federal Relief for Health Care Providers

Food Security

\$13 billion in SNAP and Child Nutrition Benefits

Transportation

\$45 billion for Transportation

What's in the Bill

Small Business Support

- \$284 billion for Paycheck Protection Program
- \$15 billion in Grants for Live Venues
- \$10 billion in EIDL Grants
- Modifies the Employee Retention Tax Credit



Paycheck Protection Program

- Re-opened Upon Enactment and Extended Through 3/31/21
- Expands List of Eligible Expenses
- Second Draw for Hard Hit Businesses
- Simplified Forgiveness for Small Loans
- Overturns IRS Guidance Regarding Forgiveness and Deductibility of Expenses
- EIDL Grant No Longer Reduces Forgiveness
- 501(c)(6) Non-Profits (Chambers of Commerce)



Employee Retention Tax Credit

- Increases credit from 50% to 70% (1/1/21 to 6/30/21)
- Lowers Eligibility Threshold to Employers Experiencing a 20% Loss in Receipts
- Raises Employee Cap to 500 or Fewer
- Per Quarter vs. Per Year
- Can Receive a PPP and Employee Retention Tax Credit

CORONAVIRUS EMERGENCY LOANS Small Business Guide and Checklist

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act allocated \$350 billion to help small businesses keep workers employed amid the pandemic and economic downturn. Known as the Paycheck Protection Program, the initiative provides 100% federally guaranteed loans to small businesses.

Importantly, these loans may be forgiven if borrowers maintain their payrolls during the crisis or restore their payrolls afterward.

The administration soon will release more details including the list of lenders offering loans under the program. In the meantime, the U.S. Chamber of Commerce has issued this guide to help small businesses and self-employed individuals prepare to file for a loan.



Biden's American Rescue Plan overview

Key Provisions

- \$1.9T price tag
- \$20B for a national vaccine program
- \$50B to expand testing
- \$170B to schools for safety equipment
- \$1,400 stimulus checks
- Eviction and foreclosure moratorium through Sept. 2021
- Minimum wage increase to \$15/hour
- Federal unemployment benefits increase to \$400/week through September 2021 with automatic stabilizers
- Child tax credit increases
 - \$3,600/year for children under 6
 - \$3,000/year for children between ages 6 and 17
- Earned Income Tax Credit increase from \$530 to \$1,500
- Grants to over 1 million small businesses and \$35B for low-interest loans, esp. clean-energy investments



Outlook

- Likely smooth passage in the House
 - · Some Dems want bigger checks
- Trump impeachment trial could delay Senate consideration
- 60 votes needed to avoid filibuster
 - 50 Democrats + 10 Republicans
- Under budget reconciliation procedure, Democrats only need 50 votes but may limit scope of plan
