








Skokomish Park at Lake Cushman, formerly known as Camp Cushman or Lake Cushman State Park, covers over 500 acres with three boat-launch ramps on the 41,500 feet of freshwater shoreline on Lake Cushman.

There are over 30 tent sites in the lower loop. Tent sites have a fire pit, picnic table, tent space and parking for two vehicles. Restrooms with sinks and shower facilities located in each loop.

There are 34 RV sites in the lower loop. RV sites have both 20 and 30 amp power, water and sewer dump connection.




