



Bottom Line Up front




Cases have decreased recently but are still extremely high. The numbers of **hospitalized Covid patients** and **deaths** in the Mason County area have remained at about the same level




BLUF cont.

- An average of **41 cases per day** were reported in Mason County, a **71** percent decrease from the average two weeks ago.
- Since the beginning of the pandemic, at least 1 in 6 residents have been infected, a total of 11,713 reported cases.


Deaths

Governor Plans

- Elective surgeries back on for Feb 18th
- Outdoor mask mandate coming off end of this week
- No change to indoor mandate
- Should have an announcement today week on indoor mandate
- King County relaxing the vaccine mandate for restaurants and bars

Testing Update

- Mason County has received test kits from the state Ordered 40,000
 - Received 14,000
- We received 9000 test kits, single test boxes from a private provider
 - Have the ability to support smaller Skilled Nursing
 - Getting test kits out to employers
- County Employees can pick up test kits
 - 1 kit per person or 2 kits per family
 - Pick up at Building 1
 - Pick up at Public Health Building 8

Testing Update

- Say Yes COVID Test ordering site opened again on Tuesday, expect to serve 290k households
- Expect to expand this program to serve 1M households
- https://sayyescovidhometest.org/
- Continue to essentially be out of POC antigen tests (have BD Triplex)
- Will be developing updated process for providing POC tests to priority groups next week

Case investigation Closed – sort of

- On the 15th we were told that as of the 15th DOH was closing much of the CICT
- Still investigating outbreaks
- Still investigating unusual cases
- Still investigating cases >65 yo as long as sample is <4 days old
- Will not be calling/notifying most cases we will need to craft a message for this

Planning Assumptions

Assuming all new cases are Omicron – Watching for BA.2 Omicron is still severe – 14 deaths past two weeks

- Driving requests for testing supplies
- Prepare to help private employers obtain test kits
- We're in good shape for now with test
- Governor relaxing masking will change the quarantine and isolation guidelines more to come
